Kristin Bauer: Her Wedding Day Details

The *True Blood* star dishes about her wedding day with editor, Chryso D'Angelo.

Kristin Bauer, "Pam" on *True Blood*, married Abri van Straten on her mother's 45-acre farm in Wisconsin on August 3, 2009. The star sat down with us days after the festivities to talk about finding a dress, a hairstyle, and how she remained calm when bad weather threatened her outdoor ceremony.

BSH: How did you choose your hairstyle?

Kristin: I chose an Alberta Ferretti dress in a Grecian style, so I talked to the hairstylist about what would work with the dress. I wanted the look to be free-floating and natural.

BSH: How did you find your flower hair accessory?

Kristin: The designer, Sara Bibb, made it to match my dress and my veil. It was just perfect.

BSH: You had an outdoor wedding. Were you worried about the weather?

Kristin: There was a storm brewing before the ceremony, but I wasn't worried—I had no control over it. My brother prepared by removing the hay from our red barn so we could get married there if it rained. Luckily, when the relatives arrived, the rain moved three miles away.

BSH: How did the weather affect your hair?

Kristin: My only stress that day was my hair. It was really windy. My hair is layered and pieces started falling out when the wind picked up.

BSH: How did it hold up throughout the celebration?

Kristin: During the service, the wind was blowing from the right direction so it was blown perfectly off my face, but afterwards, pieces fell down. Luckily, the style was loose to begin with, so it didn't look like it was ruined.

BSH: What's your advice to brides?

Kristin: Try to stay calm. I never felt anxious. I sat around in my robe and relaxed the whole day. The feeling I had was that I really wanted to be present and just notice everything that was happening.
